

Central Missouri Speedway Championship Standings Closer than Ever for L.J.S. Graphics Race Night!

Last week at Central Missouri Speedway three new feature winners and one dominating repeat winner visited the Waterloo Storage Products Victory Lane for Comfort Inn Warrensburg Station night at the races. Once the final checkered flag flew, it was Dustin Boney of Kansas City, Missouri taking home his third victory in the 'Mighty' Modifieds ahead of defending track champion Aaron Marrant of Orrick, Steve Martin of Ozark, and James McMillin of Warrensburg. For the ULMA Late Models, Bob Test of Jefferson City, MO narrowly beat Jason Bodenhamer of Centerview to the line for his first CMS feature win of the year. Concordia's 'Movin' Dave Meyer was third followed by Steve Clancy of Odessa. In the Street Stock division, Adam Portzen of Adrian came away with his first visit to victory lane this year in a hard-fought battle to the line with Michael Mullins of Kingsville, Chad 'the Bandit' Eickleberry of Warrensburg, and 15-year old Bryce McMillin also of Warrensburg in fourth. Jacob Ebert of Oak Grove also rang the victory circle bell for the first time this season in a thrilling battle among the top four drivers. Lucas Isaacs of Bonner Springs, Kansas, Brad Smith of Belton, and Dalton Kirk of Gardner, Kansas followed the leader across the line b-modified main event.

This weekend at the speedway is L.J.S. Graphics race night featuring the Army National Guard. Once again, the 'Mighty' Modifieds, ULMA Late Models, Street Stocks, and B-Modifieds will take to the fastest high-banked clay oval in the Midwest for another round in the championship season. There are several close point-standings battles already beginning to shape up heading into week number five. Past champion 'Smokin' Joe Walker of Harrisonville has a narrow lead on James McMillin and Jason Thompson of Concordia in the 'Mighty' Modifieds. Bodenhamer leads Warrensburg driver Jon Binning and Meyer in the ULMA late models. Eickleberry sits atop the Street Stock standings just ahead of Mullins and Brian Johnson of Independence. There is a fierce three-way tie for the lead in the B-Modifieds with Isaacs, Ebert, and Smith of Belton battling for the lead, Kirk is just two points behind the lead trio in the rundown.

If you like dirt-track racing finishes that come down to the wire with two, three, and sometimes four-wide racing, than CMS is the place for you. The quality of drivers at CMS is second-to-none and you will be hard-pressed to find a more dedicated group of race fans than CMS fans who are as passionate about their racing. If you've not visited CMS in a while, what are you waiting for! The excitement begins Saturday night June 12 with pit gates opening at 4:30. Spectator gates open at 5 o'clock, followed by practice laps at 7 and racing at 7:30. Adult admission is just \$12 with military and college students with I.D. and senior citizens 65 and over just \$8. Kids six to twelve years are \$6, five years and under are always free!
