

Father's Day Special Admission at Central Missouri Speedway!

After another Saturday of heavy rains at Warrensburg's own, Central Missouri Speedway last weekend, a Father's Day special is on the program this Saturday with the Missouri Coalition for Roadway Safety Night on June 19. All Dads will receive \$2 off on their admission tickets at the Earl and Susan Wall's owned track with weekly family racing entertainment for everyone. The 'Mighty' Modifieds, ULMA Late Models, Street Stocks and B-Modifieds pursuit for the season championships return to the fastest high-banked smooth clay oval surface in the Midwest. CMS pit gates open this weekend at 4:30, grandstand admission starts at 5, drivers meeting at 6:30 with hot-laps right after at 7 and the racing gets underway at 7:30.

In the modified division the question is - can anyone take away the Waterloo Storage Products Victory Lane celebration from Kansas City driver, Dustin Boney? Boney now has three consecutive feature wins along with one checkered flag feature victory from Concordia driver, Jason Thompson in the always highly competitive modified division. Other drivers showing their early season exceptional skills are the point leader, Joe Walker from Harrisonville along with Warrensburg's James McMillin and Thompson who follow in second and third. You can never count out the 2009 track Champion, Aaron Marrant from Orrick or maybe Tim Karrick out of Basehor, Kansas or Mark Dotson from Cameron to show up at the top of a talented pool of Missouri and Kansas drivers. Many of the regular and visitor drivers from all over the tri-state area compete hard each week for the \$1,000 top prize. It will be interesting to watch them prepare for the 4th of July Tom Wilson Memorial BBQ Bowl modified weekend \$5,000-to-win and a \$1,000 to start special event. Early entry saves you and your race team money so sign up at the track or on-line at www.centralmissourispeedway.net.

Another exciting battle is brewing in the ULMA Late Model division where Warrensburg driver, Jon Binning, Jason Bodenhamer from Centerview and Bob Test from Jefferson City have each won a ULMA feature at CMS with Bodenhamer grabbing two victories up to this point of this season. Bodenhamer leads in the point standings and Binning is second with Concordia driver, Dave Meyer back in a late model in third. A tie for fourth in points has Steve Clancy out of Odessa and the O'Fallon traveler, Shawn Rayfield looking like they could win a feature anytime. Brett Woods from Warrensburg now sits in fifth with two top five and other consistent top ten finishes. ULMA drivers have just two weekends to prepare and enter the \$1,500-to-win special feature event over the Fourth of July weekend starting on Friday evening, July 2 with night one inside-row qualifying races. Drivers and owners - be sure to register early at the track or online to save money.

The Street Stock division has some new drivers on the leader board with Warrensburg driver, Chad Eickleberry claiming the the top spot in another tight early season points race. Consistent top ten finisher, Michael Mullins out of Kingsville with two top five finishes is in second with the 2009 track Champion, Brian Johnson from Independence with two features victories in third. Adam Portzen from Adrian claimed the previous feature win with his first victory at CMS and could be another force to reckon with for the remainder of the season. Right behind Johnson are two new names at the top of the standings with Brian Cox from Concordia in fourth tied with the young driver from Warrensburg, Bryce McMillin. Bryce is the teen-aged son of modified driver James McMillin. It appears some of Dad's influence is rubbing off on his son from some of his varied dirt track experience.

The B-Modified class has Ethan Isaacs, another young driver from Bonner Springs, Kansas tied for the points lead after his feature win a few weeks ago. The previous feature winner, Jacob Ebert out of Oak Grove is in a side-by-side run with Isaacs and Belton's Brad Smith all tied for the B-Modified points lead. Those three drivers plus the young 15 year old Gardner, Kansas driver Dalton Kirk after his first-ever feature win, just two points behind in fourth place. Only time will tell on who takes the B-Modified title this year with another

Bonner Springs driver, Lucas Isaacs rounding out the top-five in this exciting division of young with a mix of veteran drivers.
